WEARE BOARD OF SELECTMEN MEETING MINUTES January 24, 2022

Chairman Hippler called the meeting to order at 6:15 pm.

NONPUBLIC SESSION: Chairman Hippler moved, Vice Chairman Meaney seconded to enter into nonpublic session @ 6:15 p.m. pursuant to the authority granted in RSA 91-A: 3II (c). A roll call vote was taken, Chairman Hippler - yes; Vice Chairman Meaney – yes; Selectman Burdick - yes; Passed 3-0-0

Chairman Hippler moved, Vice Chairman Meaney seconded to exit this nonpublic session @ 6:29 p.m. A roll call vote was taken, Chairman Hippler - yes; Vice Chairman Meaney - yes; Selectman Burdick - yes. Passed 3-0-0

The Board met with Hand in Hand Ministries.

Chairman Hippler opened the meeting at 6:33 pm., welcomed those present to the January 24, 2022 meeting of the Weare Board of Selectmen and proceeded with the pledge of allegiance.

PUBLIC HEARING: To hear public testimony and comment on the expenditure of up to \$40,000 from the 2021 year end surplus for a town vehicle to be used primarily for the building inspector.

Chairman Hippler reported the current vehicle's brakes are unreliable and our DPW maintenance personal declared the rust corrosion beyond repair, it will not pass inspection. This vehicle is unsafe to drive.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

<u>Frank Campana</u>, Quaker Street, asked how does a 2006 vehicle, a 16 year old truck, get to this point. Someone missed the CIP replacement cycle.

<u>Richard Butt</u>, Old Town Road, stated he is opposed to this emergency expenditure. Should have come through the CIP. He asked if the Board signed a letter to DRA. Chairman Hippler replied no.

Richard Butt mentioned RSA 32:11 a letter should have been sent. How did the Board keep the money available? Chairman Hippler explained the money was encumbered. Only six weeks away from March vote, why not let voters decide.

Frank Campana, asked why there is no public hearing for the year end expenditures. The Police dog van was purchased, now this vehicle, he hopes this is not a trend.

Chairman Hippler closed the public hearing at 6:50pm.

Town Administrator Bolton explained the State Bid list and the search for used vehicles.

Chairman Hippler reviewed the repair quote. The blame stops with the Board. If a meeting is needed it only takes a 24-hour notice.

Police Chief Chris Moore presented his DAM contract for Clough Park. Vice Chairman Meaney moved, Selectman Burdick seconded to allow Chief Moore to sign the State of NH for Clough Park for the Department of Natural and Cultural Resources memorandum for municipal services at Clough State Park. Passed 3-0-0

Chairman Hippler moved, Vice Chairman Meaney seconded to authorize Chief Moore to sign the SPCA agreement at a term of one calendar year. Passed 3-0-0
