Chairman Hippler opened the meeting at 7:04 pm., welcomed those present to the June 21, 2021 meeting of the Weare Board of Selectmen and proceeded with the pledge of allegiance.

DEPARTMENT HEAD/COMMITTEE ITEMS:

- 1. a.) DPW Director Knapp: Chairman Hippler moved, Vice Chairman Meaney seconded to hire Brandon Barton at a rate of \$17.00/hour as a Transfer Station Attendant starting July 2, 2021, with the successful completion of probation after six months to \$17.50. Passed 5-0-0
- b.) DPW Director Knapp discussed the intersection of River Road and Riverdale Road. Multiple issues in this area over the years. While base coat paving it two years ago, DPW Director Knapp was approached by a gentleman at 407 Riverdale Road in that he would like to donate land to improve the traffic flow. Covid set in and being that this gentleman was elderly DPW Director Knapp thought it best to hold off in contacting him. Recently, Weare PD spoke to DPW Director Knapp about more signage for the area. Ultimately, this brought DPW Director Knapp to reconnect with this gentleman in moving forward enhancing the area with this additional piece of land. DPW Director Knapp suggested having it surveyed. Next step, would be to bring it to the Zoning Board. The Board's consensus is to allow DPW Director Knapp and Town Administrator Bolton to work jointly in bringing this about.
- 2. PARC Chairman JaNeen Lentsch began with updates:
 - in conjunction with the Historical Society they will be hosting a Christmas Party
 - helping with the Library's Kick Off to Reading
 - Skate Park fencing repair was completed by MH Fencing
 - Girl Scouts had a cleanup at Bolton Park
 - an Eagle Scout improved Bolton Field dugouts, another to make an INFO Board at Chase Park
 - new buoys for the Chase Park swim line
 - ordered a shade canopy for the sand box at Bolton Park, Mike's Custom Canvas
 - replaced a playground piece component at Bolton Park from BCI Burke Company
 - Town Hood Memorial tennis court repairs to begin in late July early August
 - a replacement bench plaque was donated to Bolton Park
 - story time at the lake
 - Ineson Park irrigation shed roof & Bolton Park building roof need repairs bids forth coming

Chase Park trespassing issues still ongoing when the park/gate is closed. Staff logs their morning finds of trash, glass bottles, cigarette butts, alcohol, beer cans in the water, on the shore and in the parking lot and holes dug in the beach. Along with these items, the opening morning Staff was greeted by two people already on the beach. PARC Committee is looking to the BOS for a clearer violation policy across the board for all park violations. Chairman Hippler suggested the PARC to present a tiered list of rules/disciplinary action. Vice Chairman Meaney suggested glancing at other local town park rules for suggestions. Legal Counsel to review.

Selectman Van suggested having the beach street light repaired to aluminate trespassers having fires on the beach at night. Town Administrator Bolton to discuss with Town electrician.

Selectman Burdick asked if the PARC will offer swim lessons this summer. JaNeen explained they are having a hard time finding certificated swim instructors. Perhaps next year.

Cemetery Trustees - lawn care discussion

Selectman Burdick and the Board thanked Robert Saybill, Landscape Exclusive, LLC, our current cemetery contractor and Sean Monahan, his employee, for a great job in cleaning up and maintaining. The Board was very impressed with how much he has been able to fix.

He expects the maps to be completed soon, plan and proposal by August. Henniker Town Administrator, Joe Devine, shared their \$311,000.00 grant was secured through NH Homeland Security.
