Being part of the premises conveyed to Grantor by deed of Jean E. Wood dated December 30, 2003, recorded at the Hillsborough County Registry of Deeds at Book 7184, Page 1110. See also a Confirmatory Deed of Jean E. Wood to be recorded herewith.

The premises are conveyed subject to a trail easement conveyed by Jean E. Wood to The Weare Winter Wanderers, Inc., by deed dated February 9, 2004, recorded at the Hillsborough County Registry of Deeds at Book 7206, Page 1384 and described as follows:

"Pursuant to this grant, the Grantee may maintain a trail system as presently located on the above described premises. The easement may be exercised over a strip lying 12 ½ feet on either side of the centerline of the present location of the trails, and the trails may be moved or expanded only by mutual written consent of Grantor and Grantee or their successors in interest. The easement will be used only for use by winter vehicles, except that at any time, pedestrian access may be made only for maintenance purposes. If a section of trail is not maintained for a continuous period of ten years, the easement expires for that portion, which reverts to the then owner of the serviant estate."

The premises are also conveyed subject to current use taxation pursuant to New Hampshire

And I, Jean E. Wood, in my individual capacity, hereby release the reservation of right of way reserved by me in my deed to Christopher Bolton, dated November 14, 2000, recorded with the Hillsborough County Registry of Deeds at Book 6334, Page 297.

The premises are also conveyed subject to Deed Restrictions, Conservation Easement as follows:

"The conservation restriction shall consist of the following: No permanent structures shall be allowed. Responsible recreational activities shall be allowed, however, the Weare Conservation Commission, as stewards, shall have the authority to restrict prohibit uses if the use becomes inconsistent with the intent of conservation or otherwise is abusive to the land, wildlife or environment. Timber harvesting in the form of forest management shall be allowed at the discretion of the Weare Conservation Commission, Weare Board of Selectmen and Town Forester. This Restriction shall run with the land in perpetuity."

And I, Jean E. Wood, in my individual capacity, hereby release all rights of homestead, if any, in the premises.
