### Detective Frank Hebert

On June 4, 2013, Detective Frank Hebert and fellow officer's responded to a call for a possible suicide at a residence in Weare. The residence was approached cautiously, it had been reported that a weapon may be in the residence, a vehicle was observed in the driveway with a hose inside the car coming from the vehicle exhaust. On further investigation, a passenger in the vehicle was observed. The windows were up and the doors locked. The officers immediately began banging on the window and yelling to the passenger to unlock the doors, the passenger was dazed and confused but managed to unlock the door. Detective Hebert ordered the resident out of the car and he was placed on the ground, The EMT personnel were cleared to respond immediately to the scene. At this point the passenger of the car was muttering he wanted to die and had consumed an unknown quantity of prescription drugs. The resident was transported to the hospital with an officer following the ambulance, in the event his services would be needed. As the officer was waiting, he learned from the attending physician that he should be proud of the fact that the Weare Police saved the residents life today. If the resident had not been found by Detective Frank Hebert and his fellow officer's he would not be alive today.
