Arrests

Misdemeanor Arrest (Warrant): January 1, 2022 - While investigating an animal at large complaint, WPD officers made contact with the animal's owner. Officers learned the owner had an active arrest warrant for crimes related to hunting which had been secured by NH Fish and Game. He was arrested without incident and released on personal recognizance bail.

Driving after Rev/Suspension: January 2, 2022 - While conducting stationary RADAR in the area of Weare Middle School, officers observed a vehicle travelling 68 mph in a posted 30 mph zone. The vehicle was stopped and it was discovered the operator's driver's license privileges had been suspended. The operator was taken into custody and charged with Driving after Revocation/Suspension, Reckless Operation, Speeding (25+ over) and Misuse of Plates. He was released on personal recognizance bail.

Driving after Rev/Suspension: January 16, 2022 - After conducting a motor vehicle stop in the area of 300 South Stark Highway for lane control issues, officers found the operator's driving privileges and registrations were suspended. The operator was issued a hand summons for the violations and released.

Breach of Bail: January 17, 2021 - While investigating a domestic disturbance, officers discovered a person involved had active bail conditions preventing him from having contact with the other involved individual as well as an arrest warrant (Candia, NH Police Department). He was taken into custody and released on personal recognizance bail.

Driving While Intoxicated: January 22, 2021 - A Weare Police Officer conducted a motor vehicle stop in the area of Duck Pond Road after observing lane control issues. After conducting a roadside investigation, the operator was placed under arrest for Driving While Intoxicated. A sample of the operators Breath Alcohol Concentration provided a reading of .16 (two times the legal limit). The operator was released on personal recognizance bail.

Possession of a Controlled Drug: January 25, 2022 - A Weare Police Officer conducted a motor vehicle stop in the area of Riverdale Road after observing a vehicle without a valid inspection sticker. Based on a roadside investigation, the operator was arrested for possession of a controlled drug (Psilocybin mushrooms). The operator was taken into custody and later released. The felony level case has been sent to the Hillsborough County (North) Attorney's Office for prosecution.

Domestic Violence, Simple Assault: January 27, 2022 - Weare Police responded to a domestic dispute at a residence. The primary aggressor was arrested for Domestic Violence-Simple Assault and later released on personal recognizance bail.

Driving While Intoxicated: January 28, 2021 - Weare Police received a complaint of a driver suspected of smoking an illicit drug and then passing out in her vehicle at the Hitching Post Car Wash. Officers responded and made contact with the driver. After a roadside investigation, she was placed under arrest for Driving While Intoxicated. A search incident to arrest yielded approximately 100 grams of suspected heroin/fentanyl, 5 grams of suspected crack cocaine and over \$1,000.00 cash. The vehicle was seized pending a search warrant.

ANIMAL CONTROL



Dog Registrations

Any dog over four months old is required to be registered with the Town of Weare. In order to register, your dog will need to have a current rabies vaccination. Around March the town will send out a courtesy letter reminding you to register your dog(s). Annual registration runs May 1st to April 30th of the following year. For an intact dog the cost to register is \$10.00. If your dog(s) are neutered or sprayed (you must provide proof) the cost is \$7.50. If you do not register your dog(s) you will incur additional fees.

Dog(s) Running at Large

This is a common occurrence in town and we receive numerous calls throughout the year. It happens and we've all been there, however it is risking the dog(s) welfare and could potentially cause an accident if the animal is running in traffic. If an accident occurs, the dog's owner will be responsible for damages. Each occurrence will be documented, and each subsequent action will be progressive. The first occurrence will result in a warning and subsequent offenses could result in fines or a summons to appear in court.





Animal Care

Pets require adequate shelter, water and food. If an animal looks abused or malnourished please contact us. Within winter months, please make sure your pets have access to fresh water which hasn't froze. During the summer months the same standards of care apply. One good rule of thumb is if you cannot comfortably hold your hand or foot for more than 10 seconds on the pavement it is too hot and your pet could burn their pads.



Animal Shelter

Currently, the town does not have a proper kennel available to hold animals. When possible, we hold the animals at the police department for a brief period.

Oftentimes, we have to bring them to the Pope Memorial SPCA (Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals), where there are appropriate holding facilities. The SPCA is located at 94 Silk Farm Rd in Concord, NH and their phone number is (603) 856-8756. Always contact the Weare Police Department at (603) 529-7755 first to inquire if we have your dog(s) before contacting the SPCA. Also, please



note, the SPCA will charge a fee for holding dog(s) until they are picked up.
