Arrests

Nov. 03 - Arrest on Warrant A person was arrested on a warrant for a violation of a protective order (2 counts) which occurred in June 2021.

Nov. 06 - Arrest on Warrant (x2) WPD conducted a motor vehicle stop and learned two occupants of the vehicle had outstanding warrants issued by the Concord Police Department. The persons were arrested and turned over to CPD for the warrants; Theft by Unauthorized Taking and Receiving Stolen Property.

Nov. 10 - Transportation of Alcohol After observing the operator of a vehicle using a cell phone while driving, officers stopped the vehicle and took the 17 year old driver into custody when they observed he was also in possession of alcohol. He was charged with Transportation of Alcohol by a Minor and Possession of Tobacco by Minor.

Nov. 13 - Arrest on Warrant A man was arrested for an outstanding warrants (3) stemming from an incident which occurred on September 12, 2021. The warrants were for; Disobeying an Officer; Reckless Operation; and Solid Line Violations.

Nov 15 - Driving While Intoxicated Citizens reported an erratic driver travelling from Henniker and who had stopped at John Stark Regional High School. Officers located the vehicle and made contact with the driver. He was arrested and charged with Aggravated Driving While Intoxicated and Resisting Arrest.

Nov. 16 - Juvenile Involved Weare Police Officers responded to John Stark Regional High School to

investigate an incident involving a juvenile. NH State law restricts the release of any additional details.

Nov. 19 - Domestic Violence Officers responded to an incident and took an adult male was taken into custody for domestic assault. He was charged with Domestic Violence (simple assault).

Nov. 19 - Juvenile Involved Weare Police Officers investigated an incident involving a juvenile. NH State law restricts the release of any additional details.

Nov. 22 - Driving After Revocation/ Suspension Weare Police conducted a motor vehicle stop for an inspection violation. The drivers operating and registration privileges were found to be suspended and he was taken into custody. A hand summons was issued for the inspection violation.

Nov. 27 - Driving While Impaired Weare Police responded to an OHRV crash on Boyce Road and determined the operator of the OHRV was impaired. The operator was arrested for Driving While Intoxicated and OHRV on a Public Way.

Nov. 29 - Resisting Detention WPD responded to a residence for a welfare check. Officers attempted to detain the individual who resisted. After a brief struggle she was taken into custody and charged with Resisting Detention.

Responsibilities of Gun Ownership

Guns are a part of American society and culture. The United States was built upon the premise of being able to keep and bear arms. When owning a gun, it is your duty to handle and store it responsibly. The objective of owning a gun for many, is to ensure their families are safe. Please ensure you are properly trained in firearms safety and trauma care before handling or carrying a firearm for personal protection.

BASIC FIREARM SAFETY RULES

#1 Treat all guns as if they are always loaded.

Treat every firearm as if it is loaded. This is for your safety and others! Never assume that someone has handed you an unloaded gun. Even if they tell you they cleared the firearm, clear it again!

#2 Always point the muzzle in a safe direction.

BE AWARE of your surroundings!! Situational awareness is critical to firearm safety. It is your responsibility to ALWAYS keep the gun pointed in a safe direction 100% of the time. To include in your work area, loading, reloading, shooting, showing clear, or laying the firearm down.

#3 Keep your finger off the trigger until your sights are on target and you have made the decision to shoot.

Trigger finger discipline is a learned skill and is vitally important to maintaining the safe condition of the firearm at all times.

#4 Be sure of your target and what lies beyond it.

You are responsible for every bullet that leaves your barrel! Situational awareness is CRITICAL! Know what lies beyond your target before you make the decision to shoot!



HOW TO SAFELY STORE YOUR FIREARM:

Storage methods include keyed locks, combination locks, lock boxes and firearm safes. Keep the keys out of reach of children and where others cannot find them.

Store ammunition in a separate, securely locked container. Use a firearm safety device such as a trigger lock or a cable lock.



The purpose of safely securing a firearm is to provide another level of protection to prevent unauthorized persons from accessing those firearms.



Important to know in New Hampshire!

In the state of NH, you are prohibited from carrying a firearm on court or public-school property. Additionally, there are regulations in place that limit the possession of firearms in licensed child care facilities, foster homes and on prison grounds.

You cannot discharge a firearm within 300 feet of a permanently occupied dwelling without the

landowner's permission or in a compact zone.

NH is a constitutional carry state, there is no license needed to open or conceal carry a pistol or revolver in public.

If you are a resident of Weare and would like a pistol/revolver permit, you may apply in the lobby at The Weare Police Department. Upon completion of the application for the pistol license you must go to the town hall and pay a \$10.00 application fee. Once you are contacted by the police department that you have been approved for the license you must show proof of payment upon arrival to receive the license from the administrative assistant or an office on duty.
