

Arrests

Arrest on Warrant: September 3, 2021 An adult male was arrested at the Weare Police Department on an active arrest warrant from Rockingham County Superior Court.

Reckless Operation: September 4, 2021 An adult male was issued a hand summons for reckless operation after the Weare Police received complaints of burnouts being conducted on River Road. While officers were in the area they were able to hear a burn out actively being conducted. They made contact with the operator who was subsequently issued the hand summons in lieu of physical arrest.

Driving While Intoxicated: September 6, 2021 An adult male was arrested after Weare Police officers made contact with a driver in East Weare Village. The operator displayed signs of impairment was taken into custody without incident.

Breach of Bail: September 7, 2021 An adult male was taken into custody after a concerned citizen notified the Weare Police Department of a vehicle parked on the side of the road with two occupants sleeping inside. Officers made contact with the occupants and learned the driver was on bail and prohibited from possessing deadly weapons. The individual had a large knife on his waist. The case is still ongoing as search warrants were granted for the vehicle involved.

Arrest on Warrant: September 8, 2021 An adult female was taken into custody based on an investigation stemming from a stolen tractor in January of 2021. The case has been sent to the Hillsborough County (North) Attorney's Office for prosecution.

Driving While Intoxicated/ Drugs: September 12, 2021 An adult female was arrested after Weare Police Officers conducted a motor vehicle stop for an inspection violation. An investigation occurred and the operator was subsequently arrested for Driving while Intoxicated. A search incident to arrest located controlled drugs she was not authorized to possess. The case has been sent to the Hillsborough County (North) Attorney's Office for prosecution.

Driving While Intoxicated: September 12, 2021 An adult male was arrested after the Weare Police received a motor vehicle complaint. Officers were

able to make contact with the operator of the vehicle and determined he was exhibiting signs of impairment. The Henniker Police Department assisted in this incident.

Domestic Violence; Simple Assault: September 18 14, 2021 An adult male was arrested after Weare
Police were dispatched to a residence for a reported domestic dispute in progress. After arriving on scene an investigation occurred which resulted the in the male party being arrested for Domestic Violence Simple Assault.

After arriving on scene an investigation occurred which resulted the in the female party being arrested for Domestic Violence Simple Assault.

After arriving on scene an investigation occurred which resulted the in the female party being arrested for Domestic Violence Simple Assault.

Aggravated Driving While Intoxicated: September 25, 2021 2021 An adult male was arrested after Weare Police received a motor vehicle complaint of vehicles traveling at a high rate of speed. Weare Police officers were able to make contact with the operator of the vehicle who was ultimately placed under arrest for Aggravated Driving While Intoxicated and Transportation of Alcohol.

Driving After Suspension/Revocation: September 29, 2021 An adult female was arrested after Weare
Police conducted a motor vehicle stop and learned
the operator's driver's license was suspended.
Furthermore, the vehicle was not registered. The
operator was issued a hand summons in lieu of
physical arrest.

Aggravated Driving While Intoxicated: September 30, 2021 An adult male was arrested after Weare Police Officers conducted a motor vehicle stop for driving violations. Sharing the Woods

There is not much that beats getting out and adventuring into the woods to enjoy hiking or hunting in New Hampshire. The Weare Police Department wants to ensure you're being safe and sharing the woods appropriately as you venture out and explore this fall!

Friendly reminders when venturing into the woods

- Inform a friend: Tell a person who is not hiking with you where your group is hiking!

 If disaster strikes and your hiking group gets lost or an unanticipated injury occurs, someone will know the general area where you were last known to be in an instance where someone needs to be rescued!
- Pick the right trail: Stick to established hiking trails. Hunters generally like to avoid populated hiking trails because the noise may scare off game species. As a result, hunters will be situated deeper in the woods.
- Be vocal: Making Noise will often deter wildlife from interacting with the public!
- **Pick the right time**: Legal hunting times in New Hampshire are 30 minutes before sunrise to 30 minutes after sunset. Wildlife is most active during dawn and dusk; therefore, hunters are too! Midday hikes when light conditions are optimal are best!

Why is orange so important to wear?

The answer is simple, for your SAFETY! Did you know that deer cannot distinguish the color orange, but your fellow hunters certainly can! Blaze orange is interchangeably called "hunter orange" and "safety orange" as it is used among many fields because of its effectiveness to be seen by the human eye. Remember, you want to be seen by other people in the woods!



Tips on how to incorporate orange effectively

Wearing an orange hat, handkerchief, vest, or shirt is a must during hunting season. This will make you more visible to anyone in the woods. Avoid brown and white clothing as you could be mistaken for an animal! Don't be afraid to put an orange vest on your dog too!

REMEMBER: While enjoying the outdoors, keep in mind what season you are in, and what others may be doing in the area surrounding you! People enjoy the outdoors differently so please remember to be polite and courteous if you run into someone enjoying the outdoors in a different manner than yourself!

Please remember to pick up after yourself and leave no trace. Leave a

trail, hunting location, or outdoor environment cleaner than you found it. Please do your part to keep our town clean so that people may enjoy it for generations to come, while getting outside and enjoying what nature has to offer.
